"Tyler is a little boy with fluctuant conductive hearing loss, lots of problems with middle ear fluid and ear drainage. He has hearing loss more often than not, so we trialed a pair of hearing aids to see if that would help with language learning at school and behavior. He wasn't sure he wanted them the day he was fit, but wore them home and seemed pretty happy."

Jordan C. Age 16

"Jordan has a severe to profound hearing loss from birth who is now 16. He is an excellent student with a passion for engineering and is an accomplished trumpet player in his local community orchestra. Over the past 1-2 years he has benefited from various pieces of equipment that have been made available to him through the funds that have been donated to our clinic. He has experimented with a personal FM system, utilized various loaner hearing aids while waiting for his own aids to be repaired or replaced, and is currently borrowing a pair of Super Power aids that hold promise for improving his ability to hear and understand speech, but will not be available for his insurance to purchase until the fall 2016. A long-time (and successful) user of Oticon hearing aids since birth, his reaction to these particular hearing aids was amazing! He reported a noticeable difference in speech clarity, noise reduction and spatial directionality of sounds around him. He couldn't stop smiling! © Our plan is to help him hear with these aids until his own can be purchased later this year."

Ezekiel H. Age 4

"Zeke is a 4 year old boy with Down Syndrome developmental delays, and mild sensorineural hearing loss bilaterally. He has been slow to develop spoken language. His preschool teachers were anxious for him to trial hearing aids because they felt he really struggled to hear well and was now focused in the classroom. He was fit with other loaner hearing aids initially, directly from the company. But they were not reliable. We were able to switch to Oticon loaners through the Catalyst Club and his mother was so happy—these aids have an additional flashing light to let her know they are working consistently and Zeke wants them on ALL the time!"

"It was great to see Zeke not having to stand right next to the TV when he was watching a show. He could actually sit down and watch it with his brothers. It has also helped him start to verbalize sounds that before this he could not hear correctly and therefore not say them. He is a long way from communicating clearly to use through vocabulary, but these hearing aids have started him off in the right direction."

"Benjamin was fit with binaural Micon 3 Aquaris BTE's through Catalyst Club. Benjamin is a senior in high school. He has always been athletic and active in wrestling and baseball. He has been accepted to Gallaudet University this fall with plans to continue his baseball career at the university level. As such, he trains hard. Unfortunately, his hearing aids have a hard time keeping up with all the moisture (sweat) and have been sent in for repair countless times over the years. As an oral communicator with a moderate to moderately-severe hearing loss, he cannot function without his hearing aids and has borrowed hearing aids through our donor program time and time again trying to keep up with him. Today, he was fit with binaural "waterproof" hearing aids which were purchased for him through donated funds since they would not be covered by his insurance (claim denied) in hopes that they will be better at keeping up with his active lifestyle. H.S baseball season begins in 3 days, then summer season and off to college in July."

Connor R. Age 11

"Connor is a middle school student with a unilateral hearing loss who has worn a hearing aid for nearly three years with great benefit. He came in complaining that the hearing aid was very soft and he was missing a lot at school and at home. His teachers, parents and siblings were all on his case about "not listening."
